Over the Easter weekend, the National Scrabble Championship was held in our Club.



# NEW PADLOCK ON FRONT GATE

I have made enquiries with many of the volunteer members who have to secure the Club at night and on leaving lock the front gate.

Many have had the same issue as I have identified in that at night the current combination padlock is very difficult to open due to the wear on the numbers on the tumblers and also the lack of light. It is also unsafe and dangerous, having to spend more time than we should trying to secure the front gate.

I have used the torch on my phone and it is still difficult to select the correct numbers because of the glare from the colour of the tumblers.

Speaking with some members who are responsible for securing the gate, it was necessary to obtain a new lock with larger numbers. I have done so leaving the old lock on the chain as well as the new one.

When accessing the Club gate you can therefore use either lock.

Unfortunately the new lock has five tumblers and therefore I have made the new lock combination the same as the old lock but with a O at the end on the fifth tumbler.

If you have any difficulties with this procedure please let me know.

# **GREEN KEEPER REPORT**

Grass and Irrigation Report Summary

Recent assessments have identified high salinity in the bore water as a primary factor contributing to the turf issues, particularly on the A and B ends. The elevated salt levels and top dressing soil which was high in ph and sodium led to bare patches and weakened growth. This situation was further impacted by the lack of our usual summer rainfall, which typically helps flush salts and bicarbonates from the soil profile. I have been continually applying soil nutrients and vast amounts of calcium to try and move the salts out of the soil profile. Why we use bore water, no cost, unfortunately quality is appalling.

To address the issue, we've now installed a float valve, allowing us to blend bore and mains water more effectively. This adjustment provides greater control over water quality and should help mitigate similar problems

Green-by-Green Update:

- A-Green: Currently out of play due to prior damage.
- B-Green: In better condition and recently fertilised, fungicide and aerated to support continued health.



• D-Green: Has been fertilised and is scheduled for aeration within the next two weeks to enhance soil and root conditions.

• Croquet Green: Treated with fungicide, insecticide, and herbicide to support recovery and ongoing turf health. Possibly to aerate the courts late May

Additional Notes:

- Would suggest one more grass bin removal, and have it returned 1st week of September
- In two weeks' time, can we look at removing the shade covers from the North end of A and B-Greens?
